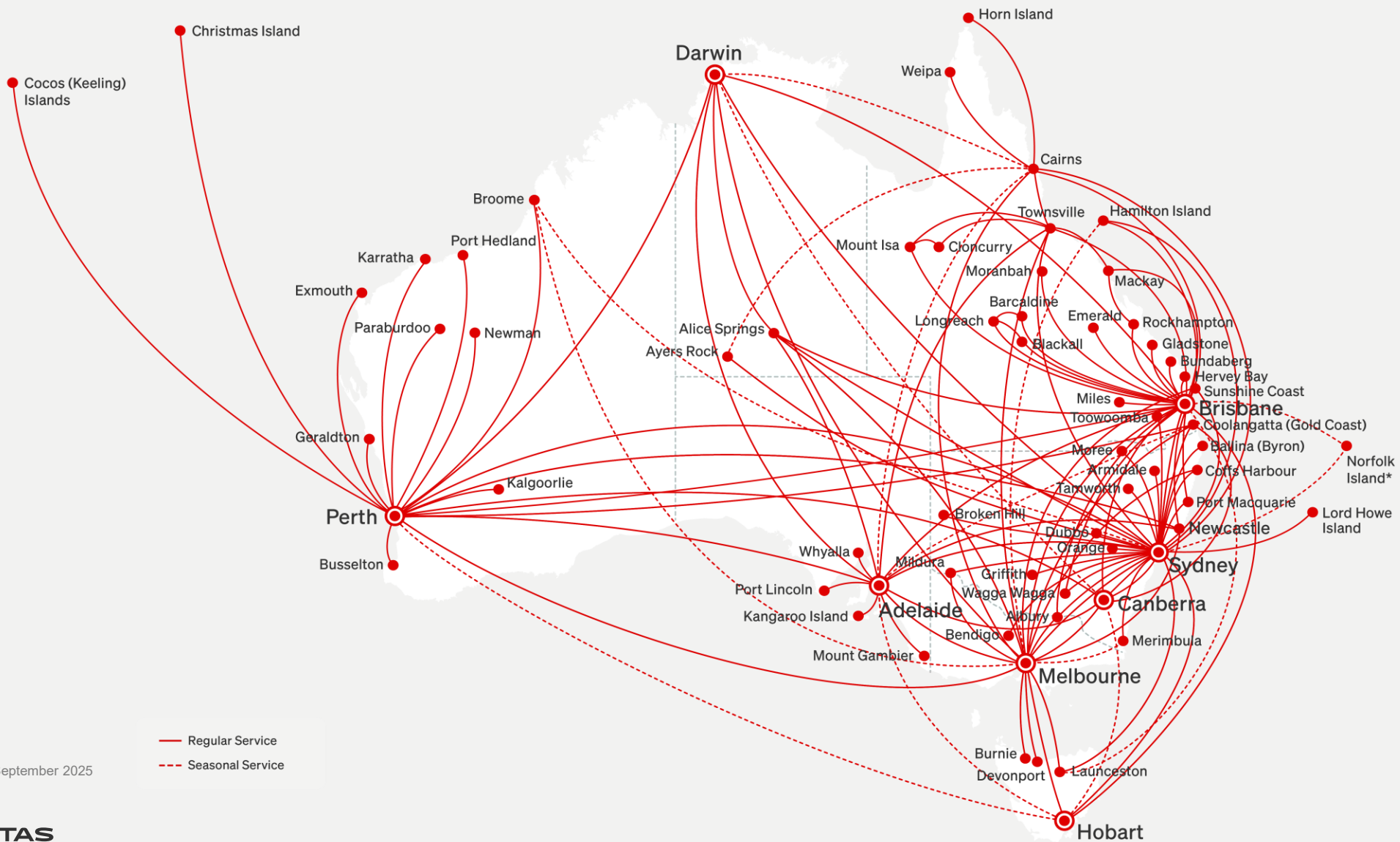

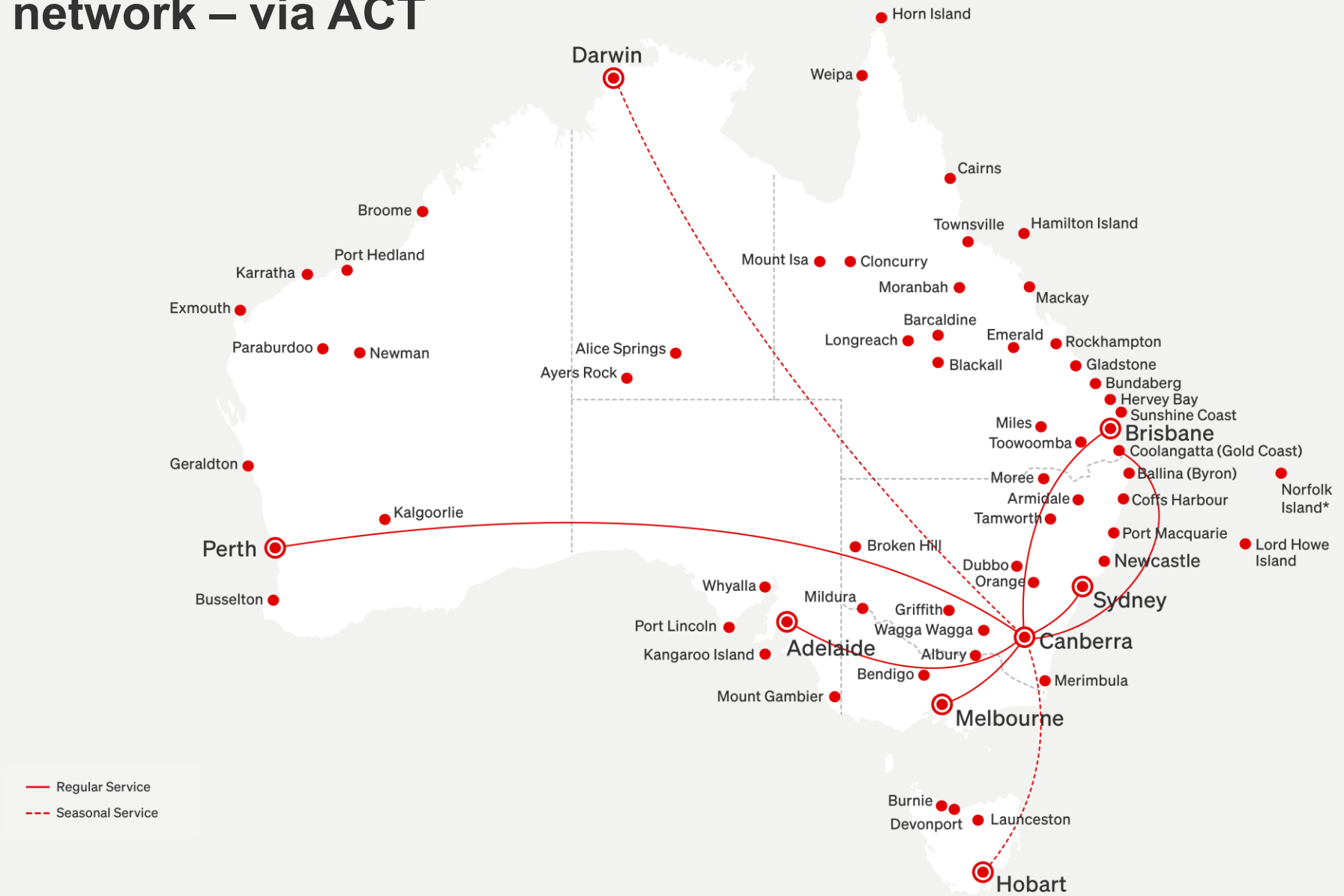

More seats for the NT

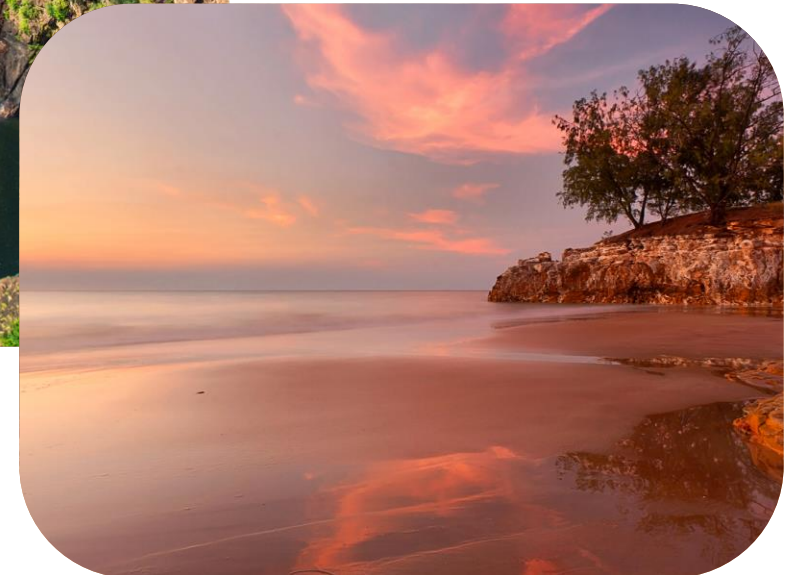
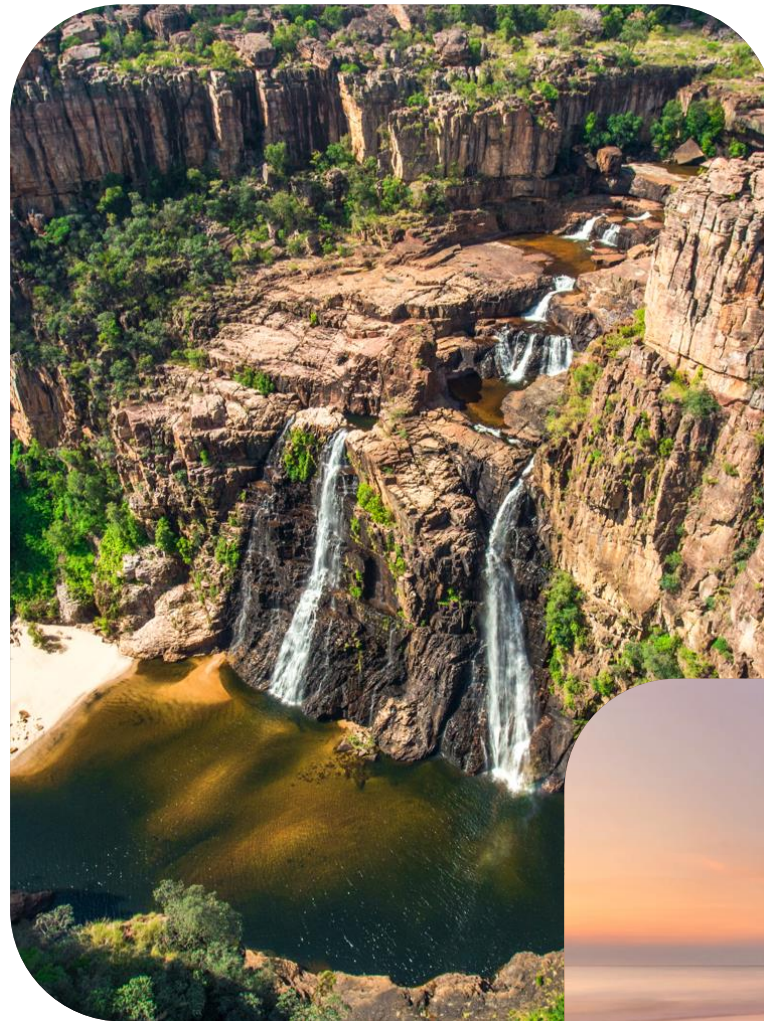
Qantas and Jetstar have announced more than 95,000 new seats will be added to/from Darwin in 2025. This major capacity increase will provide more flight options and lower airfares while further supporting the Top End's tourism economy.

Darwin to Adelaide: Up to 14 Qantas flights a week from April to May. Jetstar will also increase flights from four up to seven a week between July and October. During the peak July to October period, Qantas and Jetstar will operate three times daily between Darwin and Adelaide.

Darwin to Brisbane: Up to 10 Qantas flights a week in May and up to 13 in June including a new daily Boeing 737 service.

Darwin to Sydney: Up to 12 Qantas flights a week from April to May, with double daily flights between June and October. Qantas Group will operate three times daily between Darwin and Sydney in the peak July school holiday period.

Darwin to Canberra: The return of Qantas' three-per-week seasonal service from July to September.

A220 Fact Sheet

As part of the Qantas Group's domestic fleet renewal program, we've ordered 29 new Airbus A220-300 aircraft.

The 137 seat QantasLink A220s are expected to open up new direct Australian domestic and short-haul international routes as more enter the fleet.

The next generation A220s burn less fuel and generate fewer emissions than previous generation aircraft, and are a step up in passenger comfort.

LONGER RANGE

The A220s have almost double the range of the 717 at over 6,000 kilometres, giving them the ability to fly non-stop between any two destinations in Australia.



FUEL SAVINGS

The QantasLink A220 is an efficient aircraft using up to 25 per cent less fuel burn per seat than the Boeing 717s they replace.

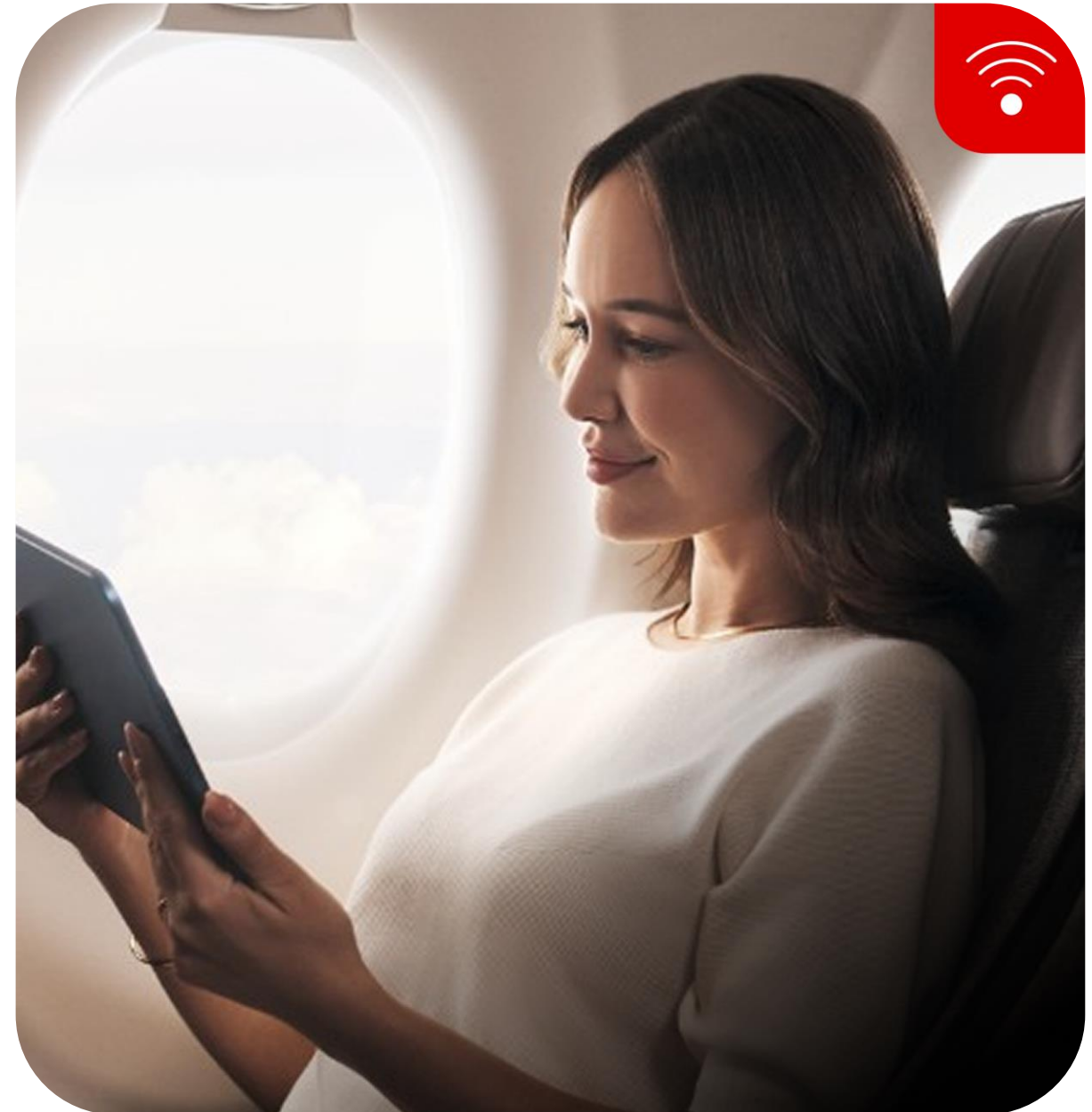

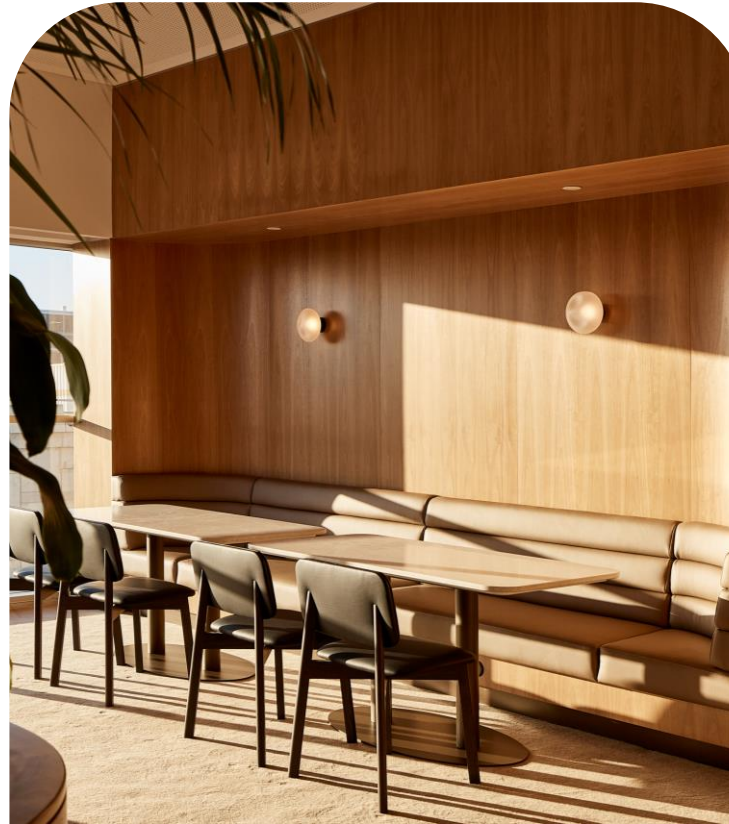

Qantas orders 20 new A321XLR aircraft

Qantas has announced an order for an additional 20 Airbus A321XLR aircraft, including the introduction of lie-flat Business seats on its narrowbody aircraft for the first time.

The expansion of the Group's largest ever fleet renewal program will see 16 of the 20 additional A321XLRs configured with lie-flat Business seats and seat back entertainment screens to serve longer routes, including transcontinental services to and from Perth, and short and medium haul international routes.

The new configuration A321XLRs will begin arriving in calendar year 2028, taking the airline's total order for the next generation A321XLR to 48 aircraft.

Qantas' first two A321XLRs, which are configured for domestic and short haul international flying, are expected to start operating commercial flights in mid-September, making Qantas the first airline in the Asia Pacific to operate the aircraft type.

The aircraft will initially operate on Sydney-Melbourne and Sydney-Perth and be progressively rolled out on other routes. By the end of this financial year Qantas will have seven of the aircraft type.
